# Koinonia Hybrid Academy Fourth Grade

### Religion

<u>Spirit of Truth by Sophia Institute for Teachers</u> is a beautiful series that introduces the Catholic faith to each grade in a way that helps students both understand and internalize our Catholic faith so they can apply it to their lives. Catechesis, scripture study, sacred art reflections, and lectio divina guide class lessons and activities. Fourth Graders also study virtues through the <u>Virtues in Practice</u> curriculum and develop a foundational understanding of our identities as sons and daughters of God through the <u>REVEALED Theology of the Body curriculum</u>.

## **English Language Arts**

- **Spelling**: Although we expect our Fourth Graders to be reading fluently, they are not finished learning phonics! Students work on mastering the skill of encoding words through spelling in <a href="Memoria Press's Traditional Spelling">Memoria Press's Traditional Spelling</a> series which goes much deeper than rote memorization of spelling words and builds a true foundation of phonetic mastery.
- **Handwriting**: Fourth Graders master the art of cursive handwriting with the <u>Writing Our Catholic Faith</u> program.
- **Grammar & Latin**: Studying English grammar is important to English speakers for obvious reasons, but studying Latin grammar is also incredibly foundational for developing a deep understanding of the English language which is so heavily influenced by Latin. Memoria Press publishes outstanding curricula which are designed to teach English grammar and Latin grammar side-by-side. Fourth Graders study English grammar with <a href="Introduction to English Grammar">Introduction to English Grammar</a> and corresponding Latin concepts with <a href="Prima Latina">Prima Latina</a>.
- **Literature**: Most of our Fourth Grade literature guides and activities come from our Connecting with History curriculum, but we will also incorporate at least one other novel study using a Memoria Press literature guide yet to be determined.
- **Poetry**: The study and memorization of poetry and Bible verses expands students' language skills and gives them a treasure trove of rich verses to call upon throughout their lifetime.
- **Writing**: In this age of artificial intelligence, it is more important than ever for children to learn how to formulate and present independent thoughts, ideas, and opinions in an effective manner. Fourth Graders study and implement writing strategies using <a href="Evan-Moor's Daily 6-Trait Writing">Evan-Moor's Daily 6-Trait Writing</a> to learn this valuable skill which preserves human writing proficiency.

#### **Mathematics**

Fourth Grade Math with Confidence is a fun and hands-on math curriculum that uses a conceptual and mastery based approach to lessons to ensure that students grasp each concept in depth before moving forward. Each day's student work contains both mastery-reinforcing problems and spiral review problems to help students learn the current concepts in depth and review past concepts daily. Math with Confidence has easy-to-follow teacher manuals that make teaching math simple,

and games are an integral part of this curriculum to help children become proficient in math concepts while having fun.

#### Science

Scientific Connections Through Inquiry is an interdisciplinary science curriculum which seeks to build a true foundation of scientific thinking through hands-on activities, data journaling and recording, and thought-provoking discussions. This curriculum cultivates wonder in students by its inquiry model which sparks curiosity and the desire to learn. Fourth Graders use <a href="SCI's Level 4">SCI's Level 4</a> to learn about biology, chemistry, physics, and earth and space science.

## **History**

Connecting with History by RC (Roman Catholic) History is a cyclical, family-based approach to studying history through a Catholic lens. We are using the co-op version of Connecting with History which includes rhyming songs, hands-on activities, art studies, mini plays, picture books, and more to bring history to life for the younger grades in a fun and age appropriate manner on school days. Home days are assigned to be as family-centered as possible with family read-alouds and family activities. The 2025-2026 school year will study the first cycle which covers the Old Testament and Ancient Cultures Before Christ time period. We will also take a break from Connecting with History in the spring for the entire school to spend a unit studying Tennessee state and U.S. History using TN History for Kids and a local field trip.

## **Geography**

An overview of maps and hands-on map crafts and worksheets in <u>Evan-Moor's Skill Sharpeners</u> <u>series</u> introduces students to a new level of understanding the world around them.
